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# **Answers to Frequently Asked Questions**

## When is the application deadline?

• Our application deadline is February 15th of each year

## What kind of financial assistance do you offer?

• We offer a very competitive financial package which includes tuition and relevant paid work. We typically pay for 70-100% of students' tuition. Students also work 20 hours per week in one of our applied settings or as a teaching assistant and are paid an hourly wage for this work.

## Is the program full or part time? Is it online or in-person?

• The program at Pacific is a full-time "in-residence" graduate program. (This means there is a 45-65 hour per week commitment in the department that includes classes, research, and TA or clinical responsibilities, and students are expected to live near campus.)

## Does the program prepare me to take the BACB® exam? What is your exam pass rate?

- The Association for Behavior Analysis International (ABAI) has verified that our course sequence meets the coursework requirements for eligibility to take the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB)<sup>®</sup> exam. We also provide supervised clinical experience which meets the BACB<sup>®</sup> Concentrated Fieldwork requirements.
- We focus both on preparing students to enter doctoral programs and to take the BACB<sup>®</sup> exam. Students in the behavior analysis program also accrue the necessary coursework and have the opportunity to accrue enough applied experience to sit for the BACB<sup>®</sup> exam when they complete the program.

## Will this program prepare me for a Ph.D. program?

- We focus on preparing students for doctoral programs in behavior analysis and behavioral clinical/counseling psychology.
- We have a 100% acceptance rate into Ph.D. programs.

## Can I practice as a licensed therapist after completing your program?

• We do <u>not</u> offer an MFT, LCSW, or counseling program. You <u>cannot</u> practice as a therapist when you are done with our program.

#### What prerequisite coursework and research experience are required?

- Competitive applicants typically have:
  - a BA/BS degree in psychology or a related field and coursework that includes at minimum Research Methods, Statistics, and Introduction to Psychology
  - relevant research experience (e.g., with a faculty member) and/or applied experience (e.g., work at an autism treatment agency, mental health clinic, etc.).
- Although not a requirement, competitive applicants will have taken at least one course in behavioral principles or applied behavior analysis, although exceptions to this are made on a case-by-case basis.
- We do not transfer in courses taken in other graduate programs or at other institutions.

#### What is the minimum GPA requirement?

• Although our minimum required GPA is 3.0, successful applicants typically have a 3.5 or better.

#### Do you require the GRE?

• We require the GRE General Test, but <u>not</u> the GRE Psychology Subject Test.

#### What is your admission rate?

• We have a competitive admissions process and typically take 5 to 8 students per year.

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
